Town of Perth Climate Change Advisory Panel – Terms of Reference

Authority

Authority transfer is restricted to the scope described herein, unless an amendment is explicitly authorized by Council. The Climate Change Advisory Panel (CCAP):

- 1. Shall provide climate change mitigation and adaptation best practices recommendations to Council as required;
- 2. Shall have the authority to assign special projects, research or matters that arise from time to time to its members that are within the scope of these Terms of Reference.
- 3. Shall not communicate externally on behalf of Council except as related to the scope;
- 4. Shall not authorize any expenditures outside of the approved panel budget;

Scope

The CCAP shall review and make recommendations to Council on local climate change mitigation and adaptation measures.

Draft Workplan

The proposed workplan will outline activities that support greening of town operations, community improvement, and or raising public awareness, about the risk and potential impacts association with climate change. The items list below are not necessarily in order of priority. Approximate time frame refers to whether this is something that can be achieved in the short term (less than 1 year), medium term (within 4-year Council term), long term (greater than 4 years) or as part of an ongoing initiative. Resources refers to whether the action item can be achieved within existing staff resources or the CCAP's allocated \$10,000 budget.
